HISTORY & PROFILE

The Rockingham Swimming Club was established in 1946, and is a year-round competitive swimming club, with a clear vision to provide every swimmer, regardless of ability or background, the opportunity to become the best they can through positive encouragement and teamwork, allowing them to connect with swimming across multiple entry points.

We provide pool and open water swimming pathways from juniors up to and including senior Australian representation, all within a family friendly and fun environment. The Club is based out of the indoor and outdoor pools at the fantastic Aqua Jetty facility in Warnbro. As a Club we strive to go above and beyond for our athletes with additional initiatives such as guest speakers, access to specialist programs, all whilst laying the foundations of life skills that set up our swimmers for the wider challenges of life

The Rockingham Swimming Club, was initially named the Rockingham Districts Amateur Swimming & Life Saving Club. Training was conducted in the ocean at Palm Beach until 1951-52 when the club moved to Rockingham foreshore. In 1974 the club moved to the newly built Rockingham Aquatic Centre to conduct summer training in the outdoor 50m pool, and became the Rockingham Stingrays. After many successful years at the Rockingham Aquatic Centre, the club moved to Aqua Jetty, Warnbro upon its opening in 2003. Aqua Jetty celebrate their 20th Anniversary this year.

- Facilities Fit for purpose Clubrooms, with designated administration, meeting areas, storage and uniform shop (store).






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ENVIRONMENTAL SNAPSHOT
